"Revitalization" By: Rev. Chuck Cram

I'm certain most of you have noticed the new logo of the United Methodist cross and flame above the entrance to the office by now - and from everything I have heard, it has been well receivedeveryone seems to think it looks great!

I would have to agree; I think it does look great. But what is even better is what the new logo on our building truly represents. You see, this is one of the first projects that has emerged from our new revitalization plan and the number of people and steps involved

is quite an inspiration. The system actually works!

It was almost a year ago-September of 2015-when I first shared а 15-page document with the congregation that



framed some of my dreams for revitalization. Some of those dreams are now beginning to take shape. We have secured some longterm financing so we can continue to improve and recondition our building. The marketing plans that we began are beginning to pay dividends. We have had new members join the church for the first time in a long time. More are on the way. We are holding new member classes, have special events scheduled like the Inclusive Experience, our social media outreach has grown from around 30 followers to over 200 in the last year. REVITALIZATION STEERING COMMITTEE

July 28, 2016 - Meeting Minutes

In Attendance: Chuck Cram, Donna Weaver, Bob Morton, Jim Hood, Sally Davies, Monte Boardman Cottie Hood

Donna Weaver agreed to be the facilitator and Monte B. agreed to take minutes for this meeting only.

Updates: Planters were finished very professionally with great acceptance. The Flame and Cross over the entrance was very well received by all.

Vanessa is still in contact with both WSU and Uof I to find exterior design students interested in practicing their skills on changes for our church exterior. Job boards will be made available for communication.

Narthex improvement: The group toured the Narthex to brainstorm ideas for improvement.

We identified the things it is used for now and uses in the future to identify what areas are necessary.

It is used or could be used for nametags, welcome center info, espresso station, food bank items, school supplies, as a mingle area, bulletins, bell storage, usher work area and item storage, hearing devices storage and coat closet.

A motion was made and seconded to spend under \$2000 on the Narthex area and that Trustees can OK the work.

A motion was made and seconded to spend up to \$350 to improve the hallway lighting.

It was decided the bell storage would be moved into the sanctuary into a new cabinet with roll out shelves for the bell boxes to lay on behind lockable doors.

The collection of school supplies and food bank items will move to the Fellowship Hall.

Chuck presented a sketch of a feasible Narthex change plan.

A motion made and seconded to allow Chuck \$750 to proceed with the Welcome Center cabinet.

The hearing devices are rarely used and have been discarded.

From Judy Higgins on the sale of the property we have another interested buyer that has contacted 2 contractors to discuss feasibility of building the home she has in mind.

The next meeting will be Tuesday Aug 30 4pm.

July 28, 2016

In Attendance: Rev Chuck Cram, Monte Boardman, Meuriel Nystrom & Cottie Hood.

Cottie opened the meeting with a prayer.

Finance Committee: The general fund is comfortable and doing well for the summer. Lani Hofer & Sue Driskill are the 2 new signatories who will be added to the General Fund checking account. Steering Committee: Chuck gave a brief synopsis of the Revitalization Committee's most recent meeting: Larry Ballantyne has finished stonework around the planters. Gayla Ballantyne and Sally Davies have filled them with plants. Vanessa is continuing to pursue possibilities for landscaping advice from a variety of sources. The committee did a walk thru of the Narthex; several people volunteered to undertake tasks. The Welcome Center's design was presented and accepted. Completion is estimated to be within the next few weeks.

SPR: Liz (via Cottie) reports that all is smooth.

Trustees: Chuck reported on some Land Title discoveries on the property he is buying. Motion was made by Meuriel and seconded by Monte to accept the revised Offer of Purchase by Chuck & Heidi to reflect the additional 1.5% interest required to be charged. Motion passed.

UMW: No Report.

Worship: Meuriel reported that the committee has discussed ideas to celebrate each specific season. Labor Day theme is to celebrate the working folks. Training for ushers and the greeters is to be done when the work finishes on the Welcome Center.

Lay Leader: No report.

Pastor's Report: Chuck introduced <u>Fear of the Other</u>, book to be used in the Inclusive Experience series, beginning on Wednesday nights from Sept. 7 to Nov 16. Clarkston UMC with also be involved and their bus will be used as needed. Chuck will be launching another sermon series on "Peace" this Sunday for 4 Sundays. He told us about the Peace Pole project and the Shower of Stoles project. Motion was made, seconded and passed to spend \$100 for a Peace Pole and monies for related expenses.

Old Business: None

New Business: Chuck and Arrie have done research on replacing the office computer and the pastor's computer and got several bids. Council approved the purchase of a new office computer from the Computer Doctor for \$950, Cloud storage for \$200/year and software from TechSoup for \$20/month for the first year and \$30/month for each year after.

Discussion was held on ways to connect with the Montessori families. Kathleen Porter is the new

owner.


