Pastor's Path By: Rev. Chuck Cram

Just in case you hadn't noticed – Christmas is coming. Don't panic, it happens every year and it happens whether or not we think we are ready. Time is relentless like that; it passes without judgment of fast or slow, ready or not ready, good or bad-it just marches on. Unbelievable as it may sound; we should take great comfort in that fact.

I believe we are a part of a creative and wonderful universe. Very few things happen by accident; rather they are part of the universal laws of nature which offer consistency, harmony, balance and predictability to our lives. Have you ever considered the fact that the universe is so predictable that we were able to build a space craft, send it to the moon, (or rather send it to the place where the moon would be in 3 days) and time the landing on the moon to within a fraction of a second? We did. The laws of the universe can be counted upon to always be true; and it doesn't really matter if we believe them to be true, they still exist and continue to function, even in our unbelief. Have you recently commented to anyone: "I can't believe it's Christmas time already"? Did your unbelief stop the clock and give you more time? I didn't think so.

For some time now, I have been trying to learn to bring more awareness to my everyday life-to pay attention to how my thoughts and emotions shape my experience of the world. It is a law that cannot be broken, altered, stopped or changed; it just is-whether you believe it or not.

All this is just to say that if we believe ourselves to be too busy this time of year, if we continually tell ourselves how behind we are and how

much we have to do, if we are an emotional wreck because of holiday stress; guess how we will

experience and shape our world? In many ways we create our own reality.

Experiment with this idea this holiday season. Be calm, enjoy the preparation; know that your attitude and self-talk will impact how you experience this Christmas season. Have you ever caught yourself uttering the words; "sometimes I just hate Christmas"? Guess what? If you create that thought

Merry Christmas.


