Like millions of other people over the Christmas holidays, Heidi and I had the chance to catch the new Star Wars movie. Like most of the others, we found the film to be enjoyable on a number of levels and even nostalgic as many of the scenes and situations seemed to mirror the original film released so many years ago. Sometimes it is fun to just suspend reality for a couple of hours and enjoy the fantasy world and the classic struggle of good versus evil.

Unfortunately, there are also millions of Christians who have been taught that this fantasy isn't as far from the truth as I believe it is. The classic struggle of good versus evil morphs almost seamlessly into a spiritual struggle of the same kind. Lucifer, the king of darkness, the devil, and spiritual demons that possess and create havoc are very real in the minds of many.

I mentioned this as unfortunate because I believe this idea and belief system is not only misguided and dangerous, but it also diminishes the Divine. Don't misunderstand, there is plenty of evil in the world and people who participate in bad behavior, but that is a different manifestation of our humanness than actually believing the evil has some power.

In the Star Wars saga the "Dark Side" is able to utilize and access super natural powers to control people, move inanimate objects, cause people to quit breathing and a host of other fantastic attributes that lend themselves nicely to Hollywood special effects. But once you leave

the theater, that fantasy should be replaced with a thoughtful and reasonable approach to spirituality. But for many, the fantasy and the accompanying fear persist.




