Pastor's Path - Pet Peeves By: Rev. Chuck Cram

I guess we all have our pet peeves. In spite of what the New Testament teaches us about judging others, there are still times when I personally struggle a little bit not to judge certain things which I find just ridiculous. Loud motorcycles are one of those things. I can hardly control myself when Heidi and I are in a conversation while walking along the levee trail next to Snake River Avenue when some motorcyclist roars by; the noise is so intense that it interrupts the conversation, leaves our ears about to bleed and makes our insides shake. My response is almost always the same; "why is that legal?" I ask, "it is rude and obnoxious".

My son tells me that a motorcycle that is loud is safer. I take exception to that argument as well; most of the noise happens long after the motorcycle is past, not as it approaches when you truly need the safety. Further, I rode a motorcycle in Denver traffic for a number of years and it was about as loud as a sewing machine; I considered it my responsibility to recognize that I was almost invisible in certain situations, which I did, and never had so much as even a close call.

When the short-piped roaring contraption whizzes by vibrating everything that is not nailed down, I often think it must be an immature teenager or very young adult who has not yet learned the wisdom of silence. Then I notice the rider is at least as old as I am, and I'm left a little bewildered. Don't get me wrong, I like motorcycles, I always have; but the loud ones?-well there isn't a river deep enough...

It is probably bad form to admit my shortcomings in such a public way, but I mention my attitude (which I'm working on) about loud motorcycles for a reason. That reason is because I feel the same way about loud Christians.

Oh, no-now I am really in deep weeds. Not only do the teachings of Jesus tell us not to judge others, but it also tells us to let our lights shine, and go ye into all the world and put our lamp on the lamp stand and not under a bushel and so on. In spite of those teachings, which are open to interpretation I might add, my conclusion about loud motorcycles and loud Christians tends to be the same; rude and obnoxious.

That doesn't mean we should not share the Good News or that no one should ever ride a motorcycle; it just means that how you say something is just as important as what you say. I believe in low-pressure, subtle approaches that appeal to a person's sense of reason and sense of compassion when it comes to sharing the Good News; I prefer to speak softly the language of love instead of shouting fear from the rooftops.

Over the next few months you will begin to see the evidence of this position as we begin to move forward with the

Church Council Meeting Minutes

April 23, 2015

<u>In Attendance:</u> Cottie Hood, Larry Ballantyne, Carl Paulson, Gary Chesnut, Rita Mills, Rhonda Edens, Chuck Cram, Heidi Cram, Patty Mills, Susie Paulson

Opening Devotional: Isaiah 43:18-19

Minutes: approved as printed

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Chuck Cram presented the findings and recommendations of the communications committee including: Visitors' Packet, free gift of coffee, pads of ads and web-site development.

Larry Ballantyne moved and Carl Paulson seconded that we pay \$100 per month for pad of ads in the tribune for 12 months. Start date TBA. Motion carried.

Rita Mills moved and Rhonda Edens seconded to authorize the development of 100 custom printed pocket folders, to include a pound of free coffee; not to exceed \$250 Motion carried. Rita Mills moved and Susie Paulson seconded that the memorials committee be asked to purchase a commercial coffee maker and three (3) accompanying carafes; purchase price not to exceed \$450. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

<u>Finance/Treasurer</u>- Rhonda Edens presented "Church Financial Update" (attached) which will be issued monthly in the newsletter. Currently we owe \$1062.87 plus the pastor's paycheck for the second half of April.

Susie Paulson reported that VInco will accept credit cards for a \$50 one-time setup fee plus 2.75% and \$0.45 per transaction.

Chuck suggested we could use a square reader. Susie Paulson will research this.

Carl Paulson reported his findings about line of credit with Twin River and Banner Banks.

<u>Trustees:</u> Larry Ballantyne has installed carpet in the bell cabinet. Trustees and Chuck will paint the outside of the parsonage with ten gallons of paint donated by the Habitat ReStore.

<u>SPRC</u>: On going monitoring and evaluation of the new Communications Coordinator - Arrie Vogel. It was generally thought that her work is a marked improvement both in effort and content. Arrie's liaison, Donna Weaver, contacts and checks in with both Arrie and Chuck on a regular basis.

A new MOA will be in place for the new Communications Coordinator soon.

There was some confusion regarding coverage for the Nurser on Easter Sunday, the liaison for this position has been contacted and a more efficient communication protocol will be in place shortly. Our Nursery employee, barring illness, is only gone 4 times new system on communication will be beneficial for both the employee and SPRC.

Worship: Sue Stutzman has resigned as chair.

<u>New Business:</u> Patty Mills reported the youth groups will lead valley wide youth groups scavenger hunt, which collect items for Food Banks.

Joys: Chesnut's grandson Chris is visiting; we had enough money to pay our April bills.

Prayers: Herb Hobbs & Connie Alford.

Meeting was closed with prayer by Chuck.


