"Welcoming Training" By: Rev. Chuck Cram

On Saturday, May 13, we will be having a welcoming training session here at the church. Being a welcoming church may seem like common sense, but there are a number of specific things we can do to increase the level of comfort for a first-time visitor. When you visit a church for the first time, there is normally a lot of anxiety that comes along for the ride. This is particularly true if you haven't been to a church in a long time. (Like maybe since you were a kid)

Research has shown that churches who strive to be welcoming and focus on the concept of relieving some of that anxiety have a better chance of having visitors return for a second, third and fourth visit. It takes some time before someone becomes very comfortable. Those churches who ignore the welcoming aspects tend to be shrinking rather than growing, have trouble attracting visitors and almost certainly have trouble having visitors return.

We have already taken many steps to increase the comfort level of our visitors. Much of the remodeling that has taken place has been designed to accomplish this. Having a space that "feels" comfortable is a key ingredient in relieving the new visitor anxiety. But the space is only the beginning. Once they come through the door, the things that happen next are critically important. That is why we need training.

If you have ever been an usher, a greeter, a counter, hosted coffee fellowship, a liturgist or are simply interested in this training,

we invite you to attend. The training will begin Saturday morning, May 13, at 9AM. We will meet as a large group for about 15 minutes to distribute materials and become familiar with the agenda, goals and concepts. Then we will break into 3 smaller groups to help facilitate better communication, answer questions and allow people to have more personal attention.

After we break into small groups there will be three training "stations" where you will receive some specific instruction as it relates to that station. The first station will be in the Narthex (lobby) of the sanctuary. This is where the new Welcome Center has been constructed and the new "giving kiosk" will be installed. You will learn the benefits of a welcome center, what information is good to receive and give to visitors and you will learn how the "giving kiosk" works and why it is important.

A second station will be in the new service area of Fellowship Hall where a sink, dishwasher, kitchen cabinets and counters are soon to be installed. Here you will learn how to make coffee, where things are to be stored, and what the expectations are when you choose to host a coffee shop fellowship. You will learn about our transition away from paper and plastic to real coffee mugs and service ware and why that is important. You will also learn about the many ways to create an environment around the coffee time that is perhaps more relaxed and welcoming than what we have been doing in the past.

The last station will be located in Wesley Hall (across from the kitchen) and here you will learn more about the research behind certain welcoming concepts, who our target market is and how we have been trying to reach them. You will visit our web site and Facebook page and learn how these marketing efforts have already impacted our visitor traffic and how we can improve on those numbers. You will learn about how we can "boost" a Facebook posting and increase the number of people who view the post ten or twenty fold for just a few dollars.

Your instructors at these three stations will be Arrie Vogel at the Welcome Center, Susie Paulson at the coffee service area and Chuck Cram in Wesley Hall. If you have any questions about the training feel free to contact the church office or visit with any of the instructors who can answer your questions.

The training will begin at 9AM on Saturday, May 13th and we will be dismissed by noon. Plan to attend this important event in the life of our church!

Tuesday Bible Study

#### Revitalization Committee

Meeting Notes from March 22, 2017

In Attendance: Bob Morton, Carl Paulson, Chuck Cram, Pat Schrupp, Sally Davies, Jim Hood, Cottie Hood, Larry Ballantyne, Gayla Ballantyne.

**Base Trim:** The Committee agreed that the 5" MDF Colonial Style base trim will be painted the same colors as the walls, (teal & gray)

**Chairs:** Several styles were considered, including the one Sally brought from Home Depot. Important factors to consider for the 125 chairs needed are: weight; style; cost; store-ability slide-ability and food & beverage sustainability. Gayla will bring 2 chairs for folks to try out on Sunday. Motion made (Pat), seconded (Jim) and passed to purchase 6 chairs from Home Depot [like the one Sally brought]. Jim will pick them up from Home Depot and bring them on Sunday.

**Tables:** Motion was made (Pat), seconded (Larry) and passed to order six 5' round tables and fifteen 6' rectangular tables in light gray from Costco to be drop-shipped to LFUMC. Chuck will place the order. **Cabinets:** Samples were looked at and bids discussed from 2 cabinet makers. Design Craft's bid was \$2,500 for cabinets + \$450 for delivery & installation + \$800 for laminate top. Funke's bid was \$3,903 (including delivery & installation) + \$1,078 for laminate top. It was moved (Sally), seconded (Bob) and passed that we purchase 2 lower wall cabinets, 1 sink-front cabinet and 2 cabinets for the island, all in hickory with melamine interior and ready for counter-tops to be installed from Design Craft to discuss the specifics. It was moved (Jim), seconded (Bob) and passed to purchase a hickory cabinet for the sound system in the Fellowship Hall from Design Craft for \$300. Chuck and Jim (& other volunteers?) will install the Formica tops on all the cabinets. It was moved (Larry), seconded (Pat) & passed to purchase a dishwasher for no more then \$600.

**Welcome Center:** The "Welcome Center/Come as you are" logo was selected via online voting. It was moved (Jim), seconded (Sally) and passed to spend \$300 for the installation. Notes submitted by Cottie.

#### Revitalization Committee

Meeting Notes from April 13, 2017

In Attendance: Carl Paulson, Larry Ballantyne, Heidi Cram, Chuck Cram, Cottie Hood, Sally Davies, Gayla Ballantyne.

Minutes of the March meeting were read aloud by Chuck.

Thanks was expressed to Larry Ballantyne and Jim Hood for completing the baseboard in Fellowship Hall. The group agreed that crown molding isn't needed.

More sample chairs will be here at the next meeting. The group agreed to try using the blue chairs with arms rather than purchasing new ones.

The tables were delivered on April 10. Twenty-two rectangular table (rather than the fifteen originally intended as they were only available in a twenty-two pack) were purchased for \$1,649.99 including a moving cart. Four Round tables (rather than the six originally intended as they were only available in a four pack) were purchased for \$538.99. Total price, including tax was \$2,320.32. Discussion was held about how/where to sell the old tables. Chuck will check out potential best sites.

Carl said that installation of the cabinets is scheduled for mid-May.

The Welcome Center graphics have been installed. The electronic-giving kiosk is here and will be put into operation after the Welcome Center Training, which is scheduled for May 13.

Corralling clutter continues to be a challenge though the church. Discussion was held about storing the items needed by the ushers inside the rolling name-tag station. Use of power point for announcements was discussed.

Discussion was held on discontinuing use of disposable paper cups once the dishwasher is installed in the Fellowship Hall. Carl will check on using high grade plastic cups like the ones at Life Care. Inexpensive ceramic cups which could be imprinted with the LFUMC & our cross/flame logo are available from several sources. Information sheets with different sizes and colors of mugs was distributed & most favored sizes/designs were noted.

Information about or actual samples of tablecloths and runners, 2 Bistro tables and a Scriptural graphic design (to be placed on the wall between the north windows) will be discussed at the next meeting.
